Professor David Bennett is a Professor of neurology and neurobiology, and head of the Division of Clinical Neurology, at the University of Oxford, as well as a consultant neurologist at Oxford University Hospitals, UK. He is also a senior research fellow of Green Templeton College.

His research focus is to understand the pathogenesis of neural injury and neuropathic pain and ultimately improve the clinical management of this debilitating condition.

Professor Tamar Pincus is a Professor in Health Psychology at the University of Southampton, UK, and a registered practicing practitioner with the Health and Care Professionals Council.

Her research includes experiment approaches exploring psychological mechanisms in pain, observation studies to measure risk over time, trials to test effectiveness, and qualitative work, to examine the thoughts and beliefs of people living with pain and those who are part of their life.
